


Fig. 2: Podcasts for listening



The power of podcasts in enhancing speaking skills



As a tool for language study, podcasts have grown in popularity because they give students the chance to listen to real conversations and get





SUGGESTION

To improve their ideasharing regarding the discussion materials' topic, the students altered the podcast materials. It aids in the improvement of pupils' speaking flow, pronunciation, and listening skills. Shawaqfeh *et al*.'s (2024) study does not contain this kind of content. To obtain the best results, this finding will complete the earlier research.

CONCLUSION

For those studying EFL, podcasts have become an increasingly useful tool for improving language acquisition. Podcasts provide a distinctive and efficient method for students to advance their language proficiency because of their portability, accessibility, and interesting content.
